

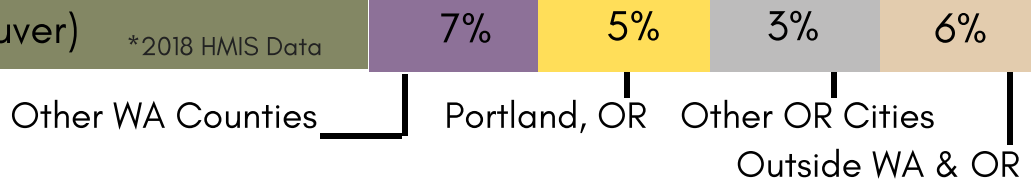

### MAIN CAUSES OF HOMELESSNESS ARE ECONOMIC AND HOUSING-RELATED

PIT survey respondents shared many primary causes for becoming homeless.

Top three:

1. Lack of Income 37%
2. Lack of Affordable Housing 17%
3. Eviction 15%

### MOST COMMONLY REPORTED DISABILITY WAS PHYSICAL

Some people reported more than one disability.
