What is a Continuum of Care (CoC)?

- Local planning body that manages the HUD CoC-funded housing and services provided in the area
 - Largely done through CoC Steering Committee
 - Council for the Homeless serves as CoC Lead Agency and Collaborative Applicant
- Community plan to prevent and end homelessness
 - Structured and strategic approach
 - Enhance response coordination



Purpose of the National CoC Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO)

- Establish HUD policy priorities
- Outline requirements for assistance projects, grant funding, and application steps
- HUD CoC Program Competition information:

- All applicants are strongly encouraged to read the FY2024-FY2025 CoC Competition NOFO published by HUD

Applicant Eligibility Minimum Requirements

- 1. SAM.gov Unique Entity ID and active Registration
- 2. Participate in Coordinated Entry & Assessment (Housing Solutions Center)
- 3. Willing and able to participate in HMIS
- Demonstrate financial and management capacity to manage HUD funds by having had at least three recent years of CPA conducted audits
- 5. No outstanding delinquent federal debts
- 6. No debarments or suspensions from doing business with the federal government
- 7. No unresolved civil rights matters
- 8. Can provide at least 25% in-kind or cash match
- 9. Follow a Housing First approach
- 10. Agree to all CoC policies and practices

- Additional dollars through Reallocation

- e-snaps project applications due October 18, 2024 at 5:00 pm
- Full CoC Consolidated Application to be posted on CFTH website October 22, 2024
- CFTH to submit Consolidated Application and Priority Listing to HUD October 25, 2024



FY 2024 – FY 2025 Priorities

- 3. Reducing Unsheltered Homelessness
- 4. Improving System Performance
- 5. Partnering with Housing, Health, and Service Agencies
- 6. Racial Equity
- 7. Improving Assistance to LGBTQIA+ Individuals
- 8. Persons with Lived Experience/Expertise
- 9. Building an Effective Workforce
- 10. Increasing Affordable Housing Supply



Application Review: What Makes a Good Application?

- Meets Requirements
 - Jot Form & e-snaps applications submitted on time
 - Concise, clear answers to all questions
 - Meet threshold requirements
- Demonstrate Capacity to Run the Project
 - Prior experience operating similar projects and managing federal funds
 - Understanding of HUD and CoC Priorities
 - Cost effective budget
- Commitment to ending homelessness
 - Clear goal of ending homelessness
 - Uses data to drive decisions and improve performance
 - Desire to be part of the CoC community



Grant Awards

- Projects expected to begin within one year of award
- Serve the population and number of units specified in application
- Communicate with CFTH & HUD on changes
- New projects seeking 1-year funding may be allowed additional 3-6 months to implement new projects
