

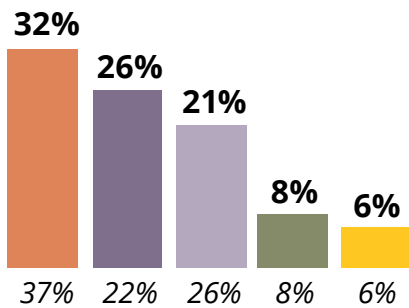
Homeless System Numbers | 2023

EXPERIENCED HOMELESSNESS AT ANY POINT IN 2023

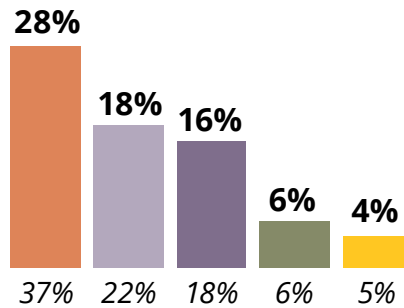

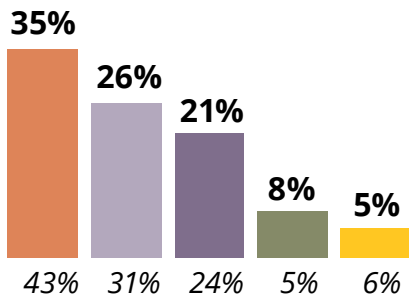

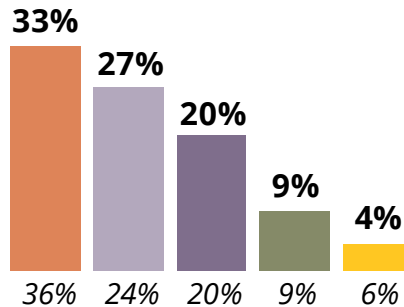
ASKED FOR SHELTER

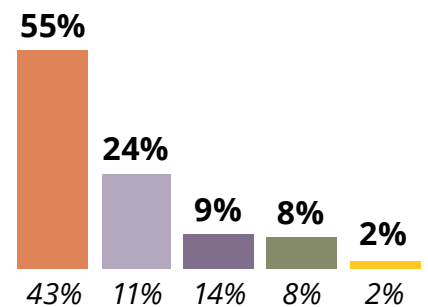
ASSESSED FOR HOUSING PROGRAMS

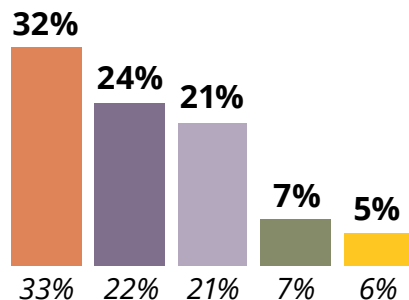
STABILIZED THROUGH RENTAL ASSISTANCE

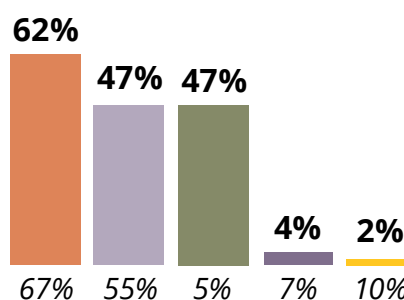
ACCESSED SHELTER
